## Subject: On-line petition Stoppt die Gift-Soja! Stop the toxic soybeans!

Thank you for your letter regarding the on-line petition "Stop the toxic soybeans!" which was sent to Commissioner Andriukaitis. The Commissioner has asked me to reply on his behalf.

As already mentioned in my letter of 17 September 2015 (ref. Ares (2015)4023741), all food and feed placed on the market, including imported GMOs, have to comply with the requirements of Regulation (EC) No  $396/2005^1$  on maximum residue levels (MRL) of pesticides in or on food and feed of plant and animal origin which have been set taking into account cumulative effects of regular consumption of foods, containing such residues.

Regarding the herbicide-tolerant soybean FG72, please note that there are MRLs set for both pesticides, glyphosate and isoxaflutole, and their metabolites.

The paper (Cuhra, 2015) you are referring to in your letter has been sent to EFSA for analysis. However, as regards the comparative analysis of the GM plants and their conventional counterparts, please note that both, EFSA's Guidance on risk assessment of food and feed from genetically modified plants<sup>2</sup> and the Implementing Regulation (EU) No 503/2013<sup>3</sup>, require that the comparative assessment should include data from plants sprayed with the intended herbicides and data from unsprayed plants to assess potential unintended effects. Thus, a potential combined effect of the newly expressed proteins and the herbicide treatment is considered in the GMO risk assessment of herbicide-tolerant crops.

I hope that you will find this additional clarification useful and reassuring.
